These coins come in 3 denominations: one dollar, 50 cents and 25 cents. Each denomination comes in two coin shapes (round and octagonal). The octagonal shape was inspired by the \$50 gold "slugs" minted a few years earlier in California.

California small denomination gold coins were struck by small private firms - normally jewelers. They enjoyed a widespread circulation during the 1852-1857 initial period when they were first introduced. Some have been found in shipwrecks that went down during the gold rush period, mixed in with the other coins those unfortunate souls were carrying on their journey.

After 1857, they continued to be made for quite a number of years, but mostly made for sale in jewelry stores and for collectors. These later issues are also quite collectible today.

They come with various designs. These designs include the bust of Ms. Liberty (of course), plus Indian Heads, Wreaths, Eagles - even George Washington and a peacock (though not on the same coin, unfortunately. That'd be really cool. Maybe old George would be riding on it, or maybe he'd be fighting it to the death. But I digress.).

Most of the engraving was really crude, especially when blown up in our famous HLRC website pics. And don't forget - \$1 or even 25c was a lot of money back then. These coins are small and thin, so attrition must have been high, accounting in some measure for their scarcity today.

NGC Registry. They range from a manageable 6 coin type set all the way up to a 554 coin complete set of the Period One and Two eras.

They are collected by major Redbook type and also by "B-G" numbers. B-G stands for Breen-Gillio, two researchers who compiled what is today the standard reference on the subject, California Pioneer Fractional Gold.

The Redbook also provides some basic information on collecting these. Lastly, on the web you'll find an excellent site chock full of information: calgoldonline.com

The Current Market for California Small Denomination Gold

These coins are currently experiencing a low ebb in interest by the general collecting public. If you are the type that likes to zig when others zag, you should consider putting a toe in this particular body of water.

Remember: these coins are made of gold, they are scarce, they are quite affordable, they are interesting historically, and they have been popularly collected for over 100 years. Now might just be the time to explore this area. And if you choose to do so, you'll find a nice selection of such coins on our site.
